These grants reflect the lasting legacies of community members whose generosity continues to shape our future. Their love of the Jewish people and commitment to giving Jewishly lives on through support for a range of needs, including children with special needs in Israel, efforts to combat antisemitism locally, and the work of beloved local agencies like Makom, JSSA, and the Pozez JCC, which are continuing their signature programs to meet our community's evolving needs. We're excited to share that we successfully completed our \$2 million DAF Partner Agency Matching Program, a major win for our community.

The result? A surge of resources to vital Jewish agencies and growth in assets through newly opened donor advised funds and increased contributions from participating donors—a win-win for our community. \$1 million in new and increased grants, combined with \$1 million in matching funds from the Jewish Community Foundation and Federation, bring greater financial stability to organizations and expanded support for those in need.

Collective Campaigns Work

GivingTuesday is launching an accelerator to help communities in "philanthropy deserts" pool resources and drive giving. Their new program is inspired by data that shows that shared fundraising efforts raise 90% more and attract 85% more donors than individual campaigns. <u>Learn more</u>

Dollars Up, Donors Down

According to the Fundraising Effectiveness Project, giving rose 3.5% in 2024, but donor counts dropped 4.5%, and retention keeps slipping. These findings highlight a clear opportunity to not just raise funds, but to inspire more people to get involved in giving. Explore more
