# GIVE: Kick off the new year by investing in Jewish peoplehood

We are proud of the myriad ways leaders in our community are working to strengthen Jewish identity, connection, learning, and Jewish joy. Below are some examples of innovations happening that engage and support more people in Jewish life and strengthen our communal fabric:

At The Well supports women's wellbeing rooted in Jewish ritual and wisdom. They create specialty resources and host in-person and online gatherings to help more women, especially those disconnected from their Jewish identity, access Jewish wisdom and form community. At The Well serves women in 34 countries and is building a growing presence in D.C., the hometown of its founder and CEO.

**GatherDC** helps Jews in their 20s and 30s connect to Jewish life and to each other. One of their signature offerings is Beyond the Tent, an immersive weekend retreat that 300+ participants since 2016 credit with activating and deepening their Jewish identity. GatherDC is working to double this program's impact by expanding it from once to twice per year.

Hebrew at the Center runs the Pritzat Derech/Hebrew for All initiative for teaching Hebrew as a second language to students with dyslexia and other language-learning challenges. This landmark program has seen success around the country and will

now help students in our community gain better access to the Hebrew language and their Jewish identity.

The <u>Jewish Fertility Foundation (JFF)</u> is dedicated to ensuring that finances never stand in the way of family. Through fertility grants, emotional support, and education, they empower Jewish families-to-be across the country. In Greater Washington, 17 families are waiting for help. With a \$10,000 gift, you can give one family the chance to bring new life into the Jewish community—and strengthen the Jewish future.

Mason Hillel is adapting the Hillel model to serve not only its campus but also Northern Virginia. Mason Hillel is using a Strategic Growth Grant from national partners as well as additional local philanthropic support to provide initial funding for two new engagement professionals to expand its reach and serve students at George Mason, Nova Community College, and beyond.
